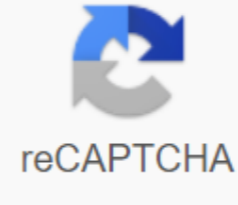

If you don't have a video game console in your home right now, chances are you'll soon-especially consider the latest round of competitive price reduction and the new online gaming phenomenon that has taken the world by storm. As recently as last November, investment bank firm Bear Stearns reported that games as a category would grow considerably faster than television, radio, movies, music and newspapers, and they seem to have been on something: Americans' spending on video games last year reached an incredible \$4.6 billion, more than the total amount spent on movies (rental and combined theater). Today's games are far from the classic Atari of the 1970s, who created most of the gurus of the modern game. The three-dimensional characters move in all directions in surprisingly detailed cartoon worlds, using complex movements that would put Bruce Lee to shame. This may explain why more than 90 per cent of today's games are purchased by someone over the age of 18 (for themselves or other members of the household). Three systems are currently shaking up the gaming world: Sony's PlayStation 2, Nintendo's gameCube and Microsoft's Xbox. They are all hits for different reasons, so you just have to choose which features appeal to you. And rest easy: your purchase will not be exceeded by the time you go home; Radically different systems are not expected for about two years, although new fun accessories are hitting the market every day. PlayStation 2 PlayStation 2: The leader in the PlayStation 2 (PS 2) pack (\$199) is the overwhelming leader with more than 11 million systems sold in North America alone. He can play titles developed specifically for him, in addition to those made for his predecessor. (This model is now reconditioned and like the PS One for \$49.) The combination means that ps 2 players can choose from more than 1200 games, four times the number available for GameCube. Many of these games, of course, were written a long time ago and do not live up to today's standards. PS 2 is a steal because it can play DVDs and CDs and has a Dolby 5.1 surround-sound support. GameCube GameCube: The Smallest Nintendo's GameCube (\$150) is the cutest of the group, measuring about 6 inches on each side, and includes a built-in handle. It uses a proprietary mini CD, so it play standard CDs or DVDs. It doesn't have a hard drive, so it uses a memory card like the PS 2 to record settings and scores. And although it has the fewest games, those available include exclusive offerings like Pokemon, Zelda, and Mario titles (like Super Mario Sunshine, which sold more than 350,000 copies in the first 10 days it was available in stores). Xbox Xbox: Microsoft's most powerful Xbox (\$199) has an internal hard drive, built-in network socket and claims to have the most powerful processor and the best graphics processing of all three systems. It uses standard-sized CDs; to play the DVDs, you will need to buy a \$30 adapter. It's compatible with high-definition TVs, and some new TVs now come with built-in Xbox support. Three's Company: What They Have in Common You will find similarities between the three systems. All the boxes simply plug into the wall and into your TV. Each box has a specially designed 128-bit processor chip. So when you shop around and see the PS 2 box boast that it has a 128-bit processor with a clock speed of 295 megahertz (MHz), it means that the chip can handle 128 yes or no decisions 295 million times per second. Many controllers can now vibrate, allowing you to ensee the experience, and wireless models for all three systems are in stores (a must-have if the couch is a long way from the TV).
